Now completing our 3rd year as a Non-Profit, we have been operating our home since late spring. In the nearly 6 months that it has been open:

We have served 12 young people.

We have housed one sibling group, which the size of our house allows.

We have seen 1 girl adopted.

We have been able to serve 2 teenagers who needed housing at the end of the school year, and to keep them in their schools, allowing one to graduate.

We have seen 2 girls age out of the system and one opt for independent living.

We continue to support Foster Parent Training classes. We have been pleased to see the numbers of foster parents in our county rise more than 30% within 2 years of our undertaking to help.

We have also distributed a number of car seats to those foster families taking infants and toddlers into their homes.

We are excited that our dreams have become reality and we thank you for your assistance. You have been donors, volunteers, and advocates, and for that we are grateful. We have always known and said that our success would be due to a caring community.
